Whether to seek fame, to make money, or out of sheer devilment, writers have been lying to us for centuries: women have pretended to be men; young poets have pretended to be medieval; nobodies have pretended to be somebodies.

In these talks, we'll discuss a range of notorious hoaxers:

- Thomas Chatterton
- James McPherson
- Clifford Irving
- the entirely imaginary Australian poet "Erne Malley"
- the Intellectual Impostures of Alan Sokal
- the forger who "found" new poems by Emily Dickinson, and whose crimes led to murder...

We will of course examine the famous scandal that ruined the reputation of an esteemed academic and peer of the realm (and which launched the career of Robert Harris...) and we'll look at William Boyd, not least for his biography of the fictional artist Nat Tate.


We'll go on to ask deeper questions:
